All staff, volunteers, students and parents/guardians must wear a mask when coming into the barn. Students will be allowed to lower or remove their masks once they have mounted the horse, but they must be put back un when they are done riding.

Please do not come to the barn if you or a member of your household have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, have traveled in the last 14 days, or exhibit any of the following symptoms:

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea or vomiting
- New loss of taste or smell
